#### JANUARY LETTER FROM JONATHAN

#### Epiphany

I was a New Year baby, born on 1<sup>st</sup> January, and so the start of each new year also coincides with the end of another trip around the sun for me personally and the start of new one. New years and birthdays are always times for reflecting on what is past and what is to come, and I get both doses in one go!

The Church's 'new year' begins with Advent, a time that we spend waiting, and then Christmas comes along, and we celebrate with thanksgiving. And then, the new calendar year for the Church is the season of Epiphany. A time when we've arrived at the big reveal moment and now have to look ahead to what it all means for us.

Epiphany is a bigger scheme than just that twelfth day of Christmas when we take down the decorations. And thinking about the themes of Gifts and Stars will allow us to explore how we can see beyond the obvious glitter to a deeper appreciation of all that we have been given. We spend the season of Epiphany looking at the various moments of revelation – Jesus's Baptism, the Wedding at Cana and culminating in Simeon's declaration at Candlemas. But we start with the Magi, known variously as kings, wise men, or astrologers. We don't know much about them, and we can't even be sure if there were three of them (we only know that they brought three gifts). The 10th Century monk Aelfric gave them the title of *Tungelwitegan*, which means "star wise" which seems to be a particularly fitting title for them. They follow a star that can sometimes flicker. The light isn't always steady, but it never disappears. The Magi teach us that we must learn to persevere, to trust in the signs God throws in our path. To strive towards our own star.

And what will be our reward? Gifts beyond our imagining. The gifts the Magi bring may appear useless at first for a homeless teenage mother, but she will ponder them in her heart, and they can lead us to a truer understanding of Jesus' divinity and authority. God born as a baby. The Magi set eyes on God here with us on earth, and that was the greatest gift that they received in return.

As we start this new year, we too need to be "star wise," Like Mary, we need to look beyond what we initially see and see as the Magi did. We need to see things how God sees them.
