

#### **Letter from Andy for 21st November**

Tomorrow is known as the feast of Christ the King. The words 'Christ' and 'Messiah' have the same meaning, that of 'the one who has been anointed'. The anointing in question was often by a messenger from God anointing the new King (see Samuel's anointing of the next King, David, in 1 Samuel 16:13), so the feast of Christ the King could be translated 'the feast of the one anointed king of king', which is somewhat redundant, but it emphasises both Jesus' kingship and the place from where his kingship is derived, God.

While the idea of Christ being the king of the universe is an ancient concept, holding a feast in honour of his glory is relatively recent, only being instituted in 1925 by pope Pius the XI, so nearly 100 years ago. At that time, with the memory of the First World War and the Spanish Flu pandemic fresh in societies' minds, the reminder that our earthly rulers are but temporal and failing shadows of the ultimate and eternal ruler of the universe must have been a powerful symbol of the true state of affairs.

By asserting Christ as the all-powerful, eternal and perfect king we are lead in two directions.

Firstly, we recognise that our earthly rulers are human, frail and prone to failure. They are deserving of our sympathy and our prayers, as well as our challenge when they make mistakes. I know the Netflix Series 'The Crown' is a fabrication, but while the details may be

false the arrogance, entitlement and foolishness is all too true of all humans, not just royalty.

Secondly, and more importantly, we recognise whose servants we are, and under whose kingship and rule we serve. We may be English, but our ultimate ruler is Christ. We may have the Queen as our sovereign and Boris Johnson as her Prime Minister, but our allegiance is to God and his laws.

In his encyclical establishing the feast of Christ the King Pope Pius put it much more eloquently than I ever could:

"If to Christ our Lord is given all power in heaven and on earth; if all men, purchased by his precious blood, are by a new right subjected to his dominion; if this power embraces all men, it must be clear that not one of our faculties is exempt from his empire. He must reign in our minds, which should assent with perfect submission and firm belief to revealed truths and to the doctrines of Christ. He must reign in our wills, which should obey the laws and precepts of God. He must reign in our hearts, which should spurn natural desires and love God above all things, and cleave to him alone. He must reign in our bodies and in our members, which should serve as instruments for the interior sanctification of our souls, or to use the words of the Apostle Paul, as instruments of justice unto God."
