

Andy's letter Saturday 19 June 2021

Dear all

We all knew it had to come at some point, and there's a sense of both relief and sadness as that moment arrives. While we're not yet officially out of lockdown, as there seems to be a sufficient move back to a more normal life in society we have decided that now is the time to stop the reflections. So from Monday onwards you will no longer be getting a daily email linking you to a YouTube video.

I looked back at the benefice YouYube catalogue and found that the first reflection was on 24 March 2020, and talks of Jesus healing the sick man at the pool of Beth Zatha in John 5. Since then, nearly 40 people have produced nearly 400 reflections on the Gospel reading of the day. Over the months there have been songs, poems, personal stories, paintings and beautiful, moving reflections on what the readings from the Bible meant to each person.

Thank you to each and every reflection writer; you have made the last 15 months so much more enjoyable and spiritually uplifting.

But as we move out of this time the question arises 'What next?' We have been used to each morning clicking on the reflection and being challenged by what the writer has said. My prayer and hope is that this will continue for many of the people who accessed the reflections, using nationally available apps and resources. Below, Hilary has helpfully catalogued a good number of the main resources available out there. Some are print-based, others come through an email and yet others through an app that you can download onto your smartphone (if you have one). Some are written reflections, others have music and spoken words. Some are free, and others you need to pay for.

Over the next few weeks some of the resources will be fleshed out in more detail by someone who currently uses that resource, so that people can have a better idea of what they might be signing up for. if anyone has a resource to recommend that's not on the list, please send a few paragraphs about it to me or to Hilary.

If this is an ending of a kind, then next Sunday (27 June) is a beginning of a different kind for some of the congregation. At 4pm in Thorner Church four people will be confirmed by Bishop Paul.

Confirmation is one of those rites of passage that can be a powerful witness of God in somebody's life. In essence the confirmation candidate is saying Yes to God in his or her life, they are affirming the desire to be disciples of Jesus and as such the confirmation service is a momentous instant in their growth of faith.
