Message from the Rector

A True Fast

I'm sure that most of us have been to quite a few weddings over the years. They are always a celebration of a union between two people who love each other and are committing themselves to each other for a life-long relationship. And there's always food!

In Matthew's Gospel, the disciples of John the Baptist raise the question about why Jesus and his disciples don't fast. Jesus' response to John's disciples is to think about why they are fasting in the first place. Jesus points out to John's disciples that he and his disciples are not fasting because they are feasting. It is as if they are a wedding – they are in celebration mode because they are in the presence of the Bridegroom, Jesus himself. Nobody goes to a wedding and doesn't partake in the party food without good reason. Fasting is for another time, another place.

Fasting is encouraged in the Bible, but only for a specific time or a specific purpose. Jesus fasted in the wilderness, and this is remembered in our Lenten season, when it has been traditional to undertake a fast of our own, albeit in more specific terms of going without something important

The strictest sense of the word 'fast' is to give up food, but that is not always possible or appropriate for everyone. There is a broader sense to the way in which we are called fast. It can be giving up, but it can also be taking up, and it should always be about deepening our relationship with God. If we need to give up something for a period to remind us of this, then we should that. But we might need to take something up to achieve this as well. Perhaps that is making a deliberate effort to find more time to pray and read the Bible. Perhaps it is getting involved in social action, or volunteering to help others.

In the Old Testament God spoke through the prophet Isaiah to remind us about how we should fast, and these words are a challenge to us to today:

This is the kind of fast day I'm after: to break the chains of injustice, get rid of exploitation in the workplace, free the oppressed, cancel debts. What I'm interested in seeing you do is: sharing your food with the hungry, inviting the homeless poor into your homes, putting clothes on the shivering ill-clad, being available to your own families. (Isaiah 28.6-8 – Message Translation)
